If you are wondering what channels your FM set should have, this list should help. The USPS recommends that your FM radio should have 12 channel capability. Channels in general use in this area for recreational vessels are 6-9-16-22-26-68. Less frequently used are 12-13-14-70-72-78. Coast Guard Auxilliary members may also use 21-23-83 when authorized by the Coast Guard. The weather channel for Duluth is 162.55 MHz. (WX-1 on some radios) This is a receive-only channel. Thunder Bay, Canada also has a weather station on 161.65 MHZ, receivable in the Isle Royale area.

Your AM radio can be used until Jan. 1, 1977, as long as you don't let your license expire. Up until now, the large commercial vessels have been required to carry an AM radio. This is no longer required, but they must now have an FM radio. This includes tugs, boats over 100 Gross Tons, and boats carrying more than 6 passengers for hire. The Coast Guard now has good FM coverage over virtually all of the Great Lakes. This, along with the inherent interference rejection qualities of FM, means that in a distress situation, your chanches of being heard are much better than they ever were on the old AM frequencys.

^{1/} It is recommended that in addition to the mandatory channels, each VHF ship station have both weather receive channels. A ship station equipped with a 6 or 12 channel transceiver that does not have one or two weather-receive-only channel(s) may wish to either employ one or two of the regular channel(s) for the reception of weather broadcasts or employ a separate weather receiver.

^{2/} It is recommended that ship stations which have two transceivers install channel 16 in both sets.
