



DISTRICT 10 NEWS

The Spring Conference was held this year in Greenbay, Wis. on April 4-5th.

There were 13 members of the Duluth Squadron in attendance at the Conference.

The Conference started off on Friday evening with the annual council meeting which was headed by Cdr. Ted Anderson. Saturday began early with a continental breakfast and a District Educational update. At 0900 the meeting was called to order by Cdr. Anderson.

There were reports by many officers of the District. Cdr. Anderson also reported on the Squadron Evaluation program which he has been working on.

A representative of the Greenbay Visitors Bureau was there to welcome everyone and tell us a little about the city which was different and very enjoyable.

Next awards were given out for the squadrons who had 100% participitation in the Educational Fund, they were, Greenbay, Minnetonka, St. Paul and Fox City.

NATIONAL NEWS

A recent Public Relations Committee made a survey of how students heard about the Public Boating Classes. Here's what they found; 16.2% from newspaper advertisements, 13.7% from boat shows, 12.8% from Squadron members, 11.3% from newspaper articles, 7.3% from posters, 6.9% from non members, 4.6% from schools, 4.45% from flyers, 3.0% from TV spot announcements, and 2.8% from radio.

It was reported that the National Office responds to an average of 355 inquiries each week on the Public Boating Classes.

The Planning Committee of USPS believes that boat operator licensing may become a reality in several states within the next 18 months.
















25TH ANNIVERSARY RENDEZVOUS PARTY

PREDICTED LOG RACE

What is a predicted Log Race? It is the skill of a boater as to how well that person knows the boat they are operating and able to plot a course and predict the exact time it will take to run a given course.

What is needed to enter? A boat that you are familar with knowing its speed by using rpm,s and a speed curve. a compass that has been calibrated for deviation so a True course can be changed to compass. Plotting tools and a calculator.

What is given? Each entry is given a plotted course with three or more legs. Each legs true course and distance are shown. Also a starting and finish point. Example follows.

No watches, clocks or timing aids are in view of the operator. An official timer will ride with you to keep times and advise when each legs time is near, and will total all legs for the total time of the course. Notice nothing was said about speedometers or sumlogs as they will be covered during the race period.

With a little planning and practice it is not as hard as it sounds. Why not prepare and try your skill.


