





Learn Safety

SAFE BOATING

Most of the people who died in boating accidents last year drowned in inland water, many were within a few feet of safety. Most of those who drowned owned life jackets, but when they died, they were not wearing them.

The National Safe Boating Council urges people who use small boats to make sure, before leaving shore, that everyone on board is wearing a well-fitting life jacket.

The law requires that each boat must have on board a personal flotation device for each person. If the boat is longer than 16 feet, wearable flotation devices are required. However, the NSBC warns if the life jacket is tucked away inside the boat and not worn, boaters take a chance of becoming a boating statistic. Most fatal accidents are capsizes or falls overboard. They happen suddenly, without warning and with no time to get into a life jacket.

If boaters fall into the water, life jackets keep them floating while they tend to urgent business, such as climbing back on their boats, getting to shore or keeping still in the water to forestall hypothermia until help arrives.

The life jacket is your friend for life, advises the Council

MEET YOUR COMMANDER CANDANCE HENGEL, N

The Duluth Power Squadron celebrated the beginning of its 50th year on 4 March, 1989 by installing Candance Hengel as its first female Commander. Candy was an excellent choice. She has achieved many squadron awards personally and has been instrumental in the Duluth Squadron receiving achievement awards, including the Chapman and Prince Henry awards.

Candy is the first full certificate commander in the Duluth Squadron's history. She also taught classes in Skipper Saver, Piloting and Advanced Piloting. Prior to being elected Commander, she served as our Education Officer.

Candy was born in Baudette, Mn. She is the oldest of seven children. The family moved to Virginia, Mn. when she was five. Candy took LPN training in her home town after completing High School. Her ambition was to enter nursing in Hawaii. However, a side trip to Rochester, Mn. the day after the state board exams landed both she and a girlfriend jobs. So much for Hawaii.

The first job in Rochester was on a general surgery floor at Methodist Hospital. The next was at the Mayo Clinic. Later came open heart intensive care at St. Mary's Hospital in Rochester. Following that came more education in respiratory therapy and work toward an RN degree in anesthesia.

Candy met her future husband Harvey Hengel at a party in Rochester. She was immediately attracted to his "cat that swallowed the canary smile". Shortly thereafter she began taking road and air ambulance trips on her off hours utilizing her respiratory training. Candy moved to Duluth in 1972. Because of her background in respiratory, cardiac and intensive care Candy helped upgrade the educational level of ambulance personel here in Duluth. She helped Gold Cross Ambulance improve service to the area. During this time Candy also worked at St. Mary's Hospital here in Duluth as head of the respiratory department, and then as an LPN in anesthesia. She retired in 1982.

Candy married Harvey Hengel in 1974.
Candy has no children but does have a cat named Tiger. Candy devotes much of her extra time to cross stitch. All the pictures on the Harcan are cross stitched as are many of the pictures in their home. Candy is a Jackson-Perkins test gardener for this area. Last year she grew 400 plus roses. Other hobbies include, Emmet Kelly and Norman Rockwell collections.

The Hengel's early years in Duluth were spent snowmobling and motorcycling for recreation. A motorhome and a boat crept into their lives. The boat stayed and the motorhome went. The first boat was an 18 foot runabout used for waterskiing and playing on Island Lake. The big lake cast its spell and the boat became the Hengel family toy of choice. Each of several new boats became larger in size up to the current 38 foot Carver named Harcan.

We congratulate Candy on this latest of her many achievements. We also know this is not the end of the line for her in the USPS. She is involved on the District and National levels. Candy is the secretary for the 1990 National Governing Board Committee.

SQUADRON DOCK TIPS AND REMINDERS

PLEASE NO WAKE. When entering and leaving the dock area stay close to dock. The water level rises sharply toward the opposite shore. The dock has electricity, but not in excess. Each pole that has electricity has a duplex outlet capable of supplying 15 amps or 1800 watts per duplex receptacle. That means if another unit plugged in you must share 15 amps. Most appliances which produce heat are the highest wattage users. (hot water heaters, toasters, curling irons, hair dryers, space heaters, coffee makers, fry pans, irons as well as larger refrigeratorsfreezer combinations). Amps times volts equals watts. (15 amps x 120 volts = 1800watts). The Corn Roast is the most important time for energy conservation. Each duplex has a combination lock on it. The combination is 1988. Please remember to close the box and secure the lock when you leave the dock.

Rafting to other boats can be tricky. It can also be fun or a nightmare. PLEASE OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING: Make arrangements ahead of time with friends of like lifestyles to be together. In any case the dockmaster will be available to locate a place for incoming boats and help tie up.

Review the complete list of dock rules for your safety and convenience and other Squadron members. These rules are inside the back cover of your 1989 membership roster. There is also a maps for land arrival and a chart for water arrival. Additional copies are available through the Commander.


