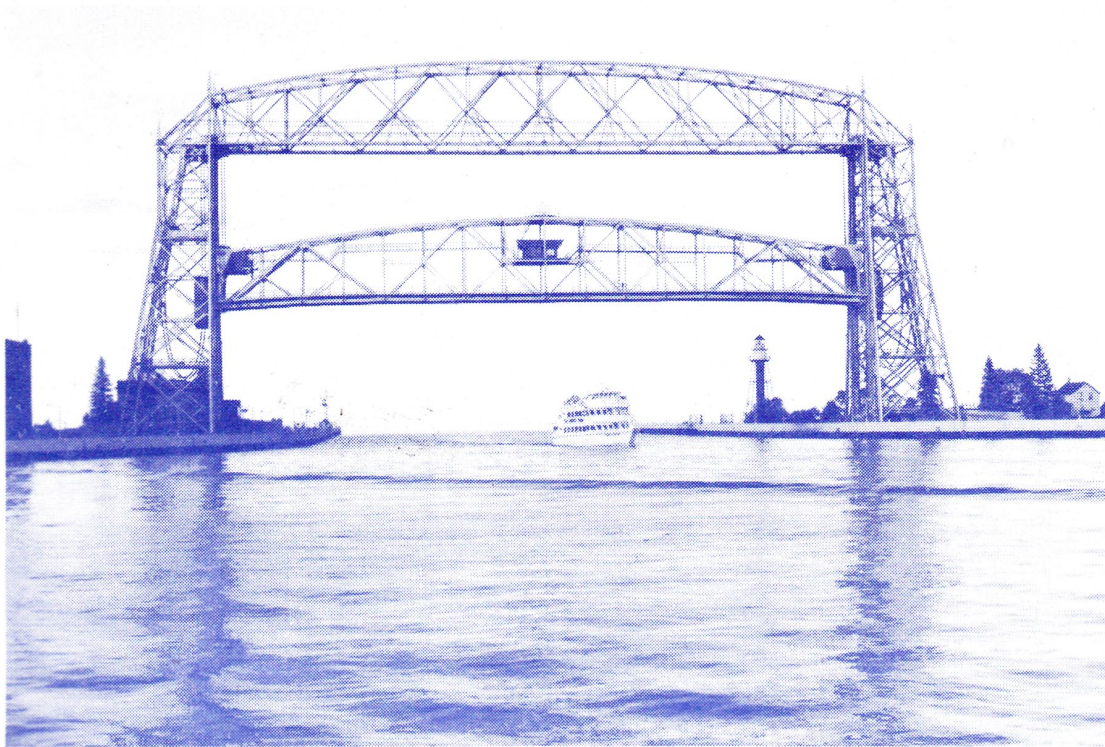

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

The USPS 4.07 Legislative Policy came to my attention as I started to get involved in the newly formed Duluth Boaters' Association, a group of representatives from area boating organizations. The Duluth Boaters' Association is interested in getting the city to improve the Duluth harbor for recreational boaters. They wanted to have some stationery made up with all of the groups participating printed on it. This is where the 4.07 Legislative Policy comes into play. The following is part of the policy written in the Operation's Manual: "Legislation which affects boating is of interest to each Squadron member and USPS. USPS or any District or Squadron to take position as an organization on matters pertaining to legislation would be to invite a revocation of our tax exempt status. Any such activity would be considered lobbying, except when a



member is acting purely as a private citizen and in no way mentions or refers to USPS."

With this policy I can only report back to the Squadron what the Duluth Boaters' Association is doing and let you decide if you would like to take further action as a citizen.

SEAMANSHIP: Tuesday, 2 October 1990, 7 sessions, 2-2 1/2 hours per night. Last class Tuesday, 13 November, exam night. Instructors: Steve & Rita Johnsen, AP's. Classes to be conducted at WLSSD. Requirements: none.

EDUCATION CONTINUED

PILOTING: Wednesday, 28 November 1990, 10 sessions, 2-2 1/2 hours per night. Four class sessions before Christmas, through 19 December. Begin again on 9 January through 13 February 1991. Last class: 13 February 1991, tentative to give open-book exam this night followed by closed-book exam within 15 days. Requirements: none - would be preferable to have taken Seamanship. Instructor: open at this time.

WEATHER: Monday, 17 September 1990, 10 sessions, 2-2 1/2 hours per night. Last class 19 November, exam night. Instructor: Robert Wilson, P. Requirements: none.

ADVANCED PILOTING: Tentative, Monday evenings, to begin as soon as Weather class is concluded. 16-20 weeks, 2-2 1/2 hours per night. Class chair: Candy Hengel, N. Requirements: MUST have seamanship and Piloting.

NAVIGATION: If the graduating class of JN's show interest in the course it will be conducted on Thursday evenings.

PUBLIC SAIL & BOAT COURSE (First session): Tuesday, 8 January 1991, 7 sessions, 2-2 1/2 hours per night. Class to conclude 19 February 1991 with exam. Class chair: Steve Johnsen, AP.

PUBLIC SAIL & BOAT COURSE (Second session): Saturday, 23 February 1991, 6 hours. Covers all the material in the book. Students given 2 weeks to complete all homework. Meet again on Saturday, 9 or 16 March, 6 hours – 3 hours for review and 3 hours for exam. Class chair: Steve Johnsen, AP.

CRUISE PLANNING: Tentative start date

February 1991, approximately 10 sessions, 2-2 1/2 hours per night. Requirements: none.

SEAMANSHIP: Tuesday, 19 March 1991, 7 sessions, 2-2 1/2 hours per night. There may be some weeks of doubling classes. Will be completed no later than 30 April 1991.

All classes are tentative, pending securing instructors, classrooms and available dates. With the exception of the PUBLIC SAIL & BOAT CLASS, a minimum of 10 students per class is required before class will be conducted. This information will be given in each of the individual flyers sent out for these classes. This overview gives you an idea of what we will offer in 1990-91 for your planning.

Classes are open to members of USPS only, all active and family members may take the courses. If a family member desires to take the courses, they MUST have taken and passed the PUBLIC SAIL & BOAT COURSE prior to registering for the Squadron courses. Check with the Education Officer if you're not sure if you qualify.

A charge for the student manual is assessed to those who register for the courses, ranging from \$10-\$20. The exams are \$5.00 per closed book and \$3.00 per open book.

Classroom facilities and instructors are pending.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM THE TREASURER

Changes in the Dues Structure - Effective 1
December 1990

What do the changes mean to you?

For the single (no Family Plan) member, there will be no difference between the 1990 and 1991 dues. For family groups where there is more than one active member in a household, there will be a savings on their National dues. The National dues amount for the second active member in a household will be half of the first member's dues. The additional member will retain ALL of the rights and privileges of membership including the right to earn Merit Marks. There will be only one ENSIGN sent to a household.

For those individuals who are currently a part of a Family Plan, the changes are these: the adult family members (over age 24) will pay

the same National dues as the additional active member; however, the rights and privileges of family members will not change. (A Family Member will still NOT be able to earn Merit Marks.) The members of a family plan who are between the ages of 12 and 24 – Junior Family Members – will pay \$2.00 per year in National dues.

The only requirements for adult family members making this change are that they must have completed the Boating course and they must share a residence with another active member. Current active members who wish to become an additional active member (and pay the smaller dues rate) must share a residence with another active member.

In October, when the dues notices are mailed, there will be ONE dues notice per household with everyone's name listed and the amount of dues each member owes.

PLEASE LET US KNOW AS SOON AS POSSIBLE IF A CURRENT FAMILY MEMBER WISHES TO BECOME AN ADDITIONAL ACTIVE MEMBER. Contact Rita Johnsen, Secretary, (525-5148) or Gloria Vitullo, Treasurer, (525-4138).
