FUTURE EDUCATION CLASSES:


Seamanship and Piloting will be offered starting in late February. Cruise Planning will begin in mid-March 1992.


So the next time you think you are only one person and that your efforts are not needed, remember this typewriter and say to yourself, "I am a key person and my participation is needed very much".






