

SQUADRON DOCK IMPROVEMENTS

If you haven't been to the Squadron Dock yet this year, plan a trip there for lunch or an overnight soon and see the new changes on the dock for yourself.

First, a little background on the dock... It used to be a grain elevator back in the late 1800's. The Duluth Power Squadron leases the dock from the current owners, Burlington Northern Railroad. The peninsula that the dock is on is called Bungee Point, after the Bungee Crop. of Minneapolis that owns all of the point except for the land we lease from the BN. The dock costs the Squadron about \$2,000 per year for the lease, insurance, and electricity.

Now for the improvements... First, the plan for a 100 ft. addition that began when I was Commander and went through a lengthy permit process, is finally now a reality. The new dock started with Joel Berg and myself drawing up plans, getting permission from the BN, and the proper permit from the DNR – this took the better part of last summer. This past spring, the plans were refined with the help of Len Middleton and Jerry Carlson. Milt Larson had his business, Northshore Steel, make 28 custom steel brackets to secure the new dock to the old cribbing. Gina Wuorinen secured railroad ties from Potlatch. Len Middleton and Howard Boynton supplied the

spikes to secure the brackets. Mike Billman brought over his heavy equipment to dig out the old cribbing and do the grading around the new dock.

The second addition was a security gate to stop the unwanted traffic on the dock. Permission had to be obtained from the Bungee Corp., Burlington Northern, and the Army Corps of Engineers to construct it. All were very much in favor of closing the point off, because of the vandalism, partying and illegal dumping that was occurring. Dave Mattson secured the heavy pipe for the gate, Tom Holt had custom brass bushings made for the hinge, and it was all welded together by Gordy Olson. The final touches of painting were done by Jerry Rock.

THE BEST PART OF BOTH THESE PROJECTS IS THAT ALL THE MATERIALS AND TIME WERE DONATED (excluding the concrete for the gate and the new treated lumber used in the dock). THE ABOVE MENTIONED ARE BUT A FEW OF THE PEOPLE WHO WERE INVOLVED IN THESE PROJECTS. MANY MORE DONATED THEIR TIME. If you haven't been involved, get involved in your Squadron's next activity.

TRIP OF THE MONTH

Four members from the Central Wisconsin Squadron had their "Our Sailing Adventure" as reported by Lt/C Mary Ann Dykes, P. Boarding the "Dream On II" at the Burnt Store Marina in February, they sailed south for two days when they alertly and smartly headed for the protection of a marina when the weather forecast alerted them that a storm was on the way. Skipper Lt/C David Swenson, AP was steering the 38' vessel when the dinghy flipped over as they were entering the marina in 30 knot winds. Only excellent boat handling under quite adverse conditions allowed all crew members to breathe a sigh of relief as they tied up for the night.

While being interviewed by a television reporter not familiar with USPS, Dave explained that Safety was their major concern, that they were on vacation from Wisconsin, and members of USPS. Dave explained the organization to the reporter while preparing the boat to weather the storm which hit at 2300 with 60 MPH winds. We did not get to see the news show but we felt quite good about having the opportunity to get a word in for USPS.

Having studied day markers, tides and tidal currents in our USPS courses, we now have first hand experience on fairly rough water trying to read day markers through binoculars, with osprey nests obscuring numbers; and also having one of two anchors come loose when the tide was going out by Sanibel Island at 0400. 
