Arriving Duluth Harbor May 10, 1994. The vessel has a keel length of 1000', overall length of 1013.6', a beam of 105', and a depth of 56'. She has a draft of 30'1", with a coal cargo capacity of 71,250 N.T. Vessel is equipped with a stern mounted self unloader 260' long. Built in 1981 to haul ore and coal, her primary cargo is coal, loading at Midwest Energy Terminal in Superior, WI. Powered by diesel producing 17120 Shaft Horse Power. This is the largest of the Great Lakes Bulk Freighters.



Reprinted from portions of an article written by Richard Bibby in the Channel Chatter issue Dec.-Jan 1988.

This historical photograph of the former Cargill Itasca grain elevator is now the site of our Squadron Dock. This picture, taken in 1960, shows the elevator's location on the dock as it appeared that year. Cargill closed the Itasca operation down 31 October 1968 and later razed the facility. Our Squadron Dock was dedicated 8 September 1973 at the Corn Roast that year and proclamation was made and presented to Lawrence Cowan in recognition and appreciation for his dedicated service and the facility was officially named "Cowan Cove". Careful examination will reveal the old General Cargo and

Merchandise Freight Shed on the outer-lake end of the dock with its tendering rail cars. The large dock in the middle, next to the elevator was the old Northwestern-Hanna Fuel Company Dock No. 1 which is presently the site of Burlington Northern's Taconite facility. (Further away from the old elevator is the gravity type loading ore docks of the then called Great Northern Railway). Our port profile has undergone many physical changes in appearance, especially on the Duluth side of the harbor, and this photograph represents change that is very closely associated with the history of our Power Squadron. It goes without saying that we are most fortunate to have this facility.




KID'S CREW WILL KICK-OFF WITH A BOWLING AND PIZZA PARTY AT THE
