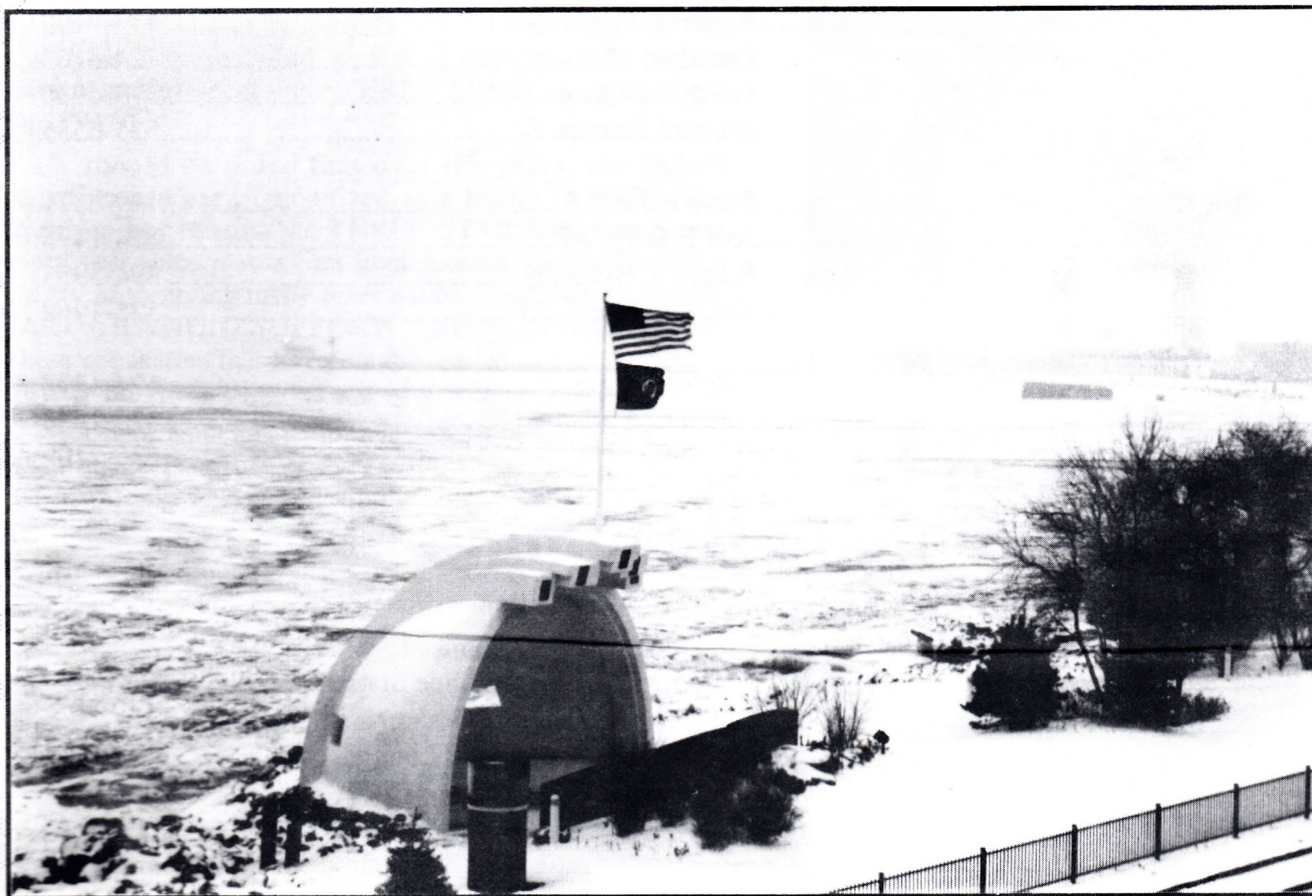

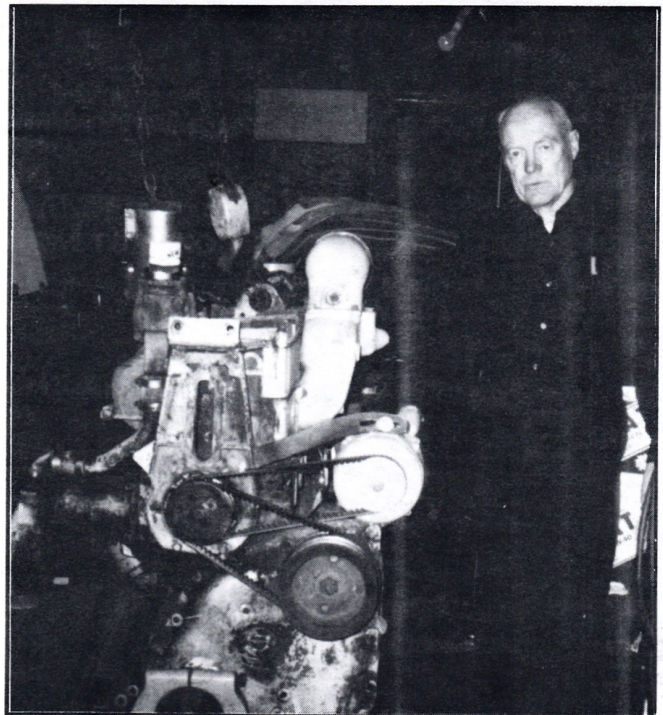


Instructor Ed Makowsky teaches from the USPS Course material and provides background information from his experience as a certified technician.

Throwables Thrown Out

Beginning in May 1995, recreational boats less than 16 feet must have a wearable life jacket for each person on board in order to satisfy federal safety regulations under new Coast Guard rules.

The new rules still do not specify that life jackets be worn. However, the change will mean that having a "Type IV" throwable flotation cushion in a small boat will no longer be sufficient. Boaters must have on board Type I, II or III wearable life jackets, or be wearing a "hybrid" Type V. The rules for vessels 16 feet and over remain unchanged.

Another change will allow states to set their own requirements for life jackets on children, an initiative strongly called for in the National Transportation Safety Board's boating safety report issued last spring. Already, 19 states have some form of life jacket requirement for children. States will also be granted the authority to set their own life jacket requirements for sailboards, personal watercrafts, canoes & kayaks.

Secretary of Transportation Federico Pena, who has jurisdiction over the Coast Guard, has taken a strong interest in boating safety and said he personally witnessed a boating accident in which he helped two people who were not wearing life jackets.

The tragic deaths of seven family members that occurred in an Arkansas boating accident last summer could have been prevented if they had been wearing life jackets, Pena said. In that particular accident, five children, age 10 to a baby of 18 months, drowned after their 12-foot boat swamped on a calm, clear day.

Canoes and kayaks less than 16 feet are also included in the new life jacket requirement effective May 1995, however, canoe liveries and rental companies will have an additional year to comply. The Coast Guard will continue its federal exemption for sailboards, racing shells, rowing sculls and racing canoes and kayaks.

Small boats were target in the the new life jacket rules because statistics have shown that 40% of boating fatalities occur in small, open boats.

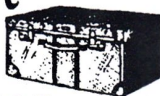

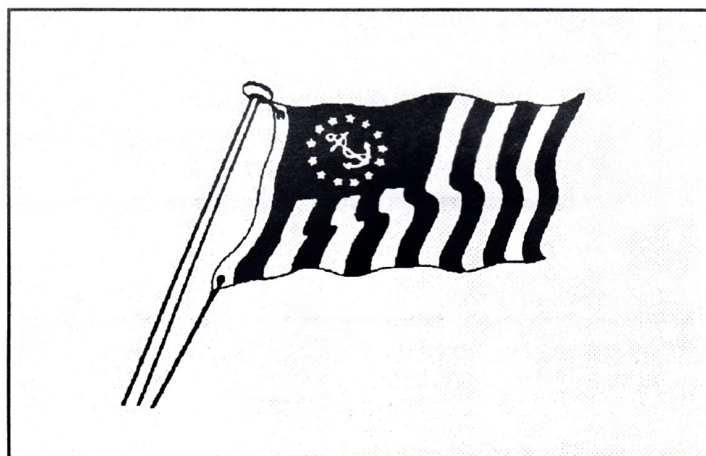
