Party was held Friday



Kim Elverum has been with the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources since 1971 where he has served as boat and water safety coordinator since 1974. He has served on numerous NASBLA committees, appointed as chair on four, and was elected president in 1987. During his career, Elverum served three 3-year terms on the National Boating Safety Advisory Council, 20 years on the Underwriters Laboratories (UL) Marine Engineering Council

and was vice chair of the National Safe Boating Council. He coordinated production of five issues of *Boating Safety Dollars At Work* for the association. Elverum has received both the NASBLA and Bonner Awards, in addition to two commendations from the Coast Guard.

# Thou Shall Not Run Thy Diesel Engine to Dryness!

The old adage
"If God had
wanted man to
spend time on
water, He would
have equipped
man with fins
and gills" wasn't
too far off this
summer as we
sailed Lake Superior. One of

the commandments of boating is, or should be, THOU SHALT NOT RUN THY DIESEL ENGINE TO DRY-NESS. This year the diesel fuel on board was about four years old sooo, we thought that we would use all of the old fuel and, when it ran dry, we would refill from portable tanks. SOOO, about five miles off the shore of one of the Apostle Islands the engine went chug—chug, — —. No problem—the sun was high, the wind was calm, the beverages were cool and liguidy, and all that we had to do was refill the tank, start the engine and proceed to the anchorage. WRONGGG! When the diesel in the fuel lines to the engine is gone, air fills the lines and needs to be purged before the fuel can get to the cylinders and the engine restarted. We read all of this out of the "How to Book" that we store somewhere on the boat each summer. SOOO, we opened valves that were sort-of in the right place as shown in the sketches and watched as air and diesel fuel spit and sprayed all over the bottom of the boat as battery power ran the "whinny pump thing". We then used battery power to heat the cylinders and energize the electric starter to turn the engine over. During each of the many times that we repeated this, all we got was a chug- chugnothing. About an hour later we noticed that the battery power wasn't doing so great and the chance to radio for aid was diminishing. After one last attempt at twisting the twisty things and spitting and spraying air and fuel all over the place, the engine finally went chug- chug- vroom. The boat smelled of sweat and diesel fuel as we anchored for the evening but the cool liquidy things tasted good in the twilight of the evening.


