Commander's Report

As you're reading this article, my watch year is about half over. It's truly going by so quickly, it's hard to imagine. I'd like to give you an update on the Spring Governing Board Meeting I attended in May. The number of National Meetings held each year was a big issue. It was approved to go from 3 meetings to 2 National Meetings a year starting in 2006. The Annual Meeting will be held January 3 - 8 in Orlando, 2006. Next will be New York City, August 15 - 20, 2006, followed by the 2007 Annual meeting in Jacksonville, FL Jan. 20 - 25. The offset to dropping one meeting per year is to enlarge the National Meetings by a day to cover all needed business and allow more free time for tours and such.

There is a new membership program in the works called "The Power of One". It provides for individual and squadron recognition for membership growth. This program will be launched during the Fall Governing Board Meeting, September 4 - 6, 2003 in Reno, Nevada. The "Power of One Campaign is designed to increase member involvement and increase membership / member retention at the squadron level. You'll see and hear more about it in the Ensign Magazine in coming issues.

A MOA was signed with the Army Corps of Engineers and the Sea Scouts.

There is a USPS Cookbook Program in progress.

Even though Anniversary Billing / Headquarters, Credit Card Billing dues collection was defeated in January, there were a significant number of Districts (D10 was one) that expressed

an interest in setting up a "Beta Test" of the program to see how it could work on scaled down version. To that end, National is looking for several volunteer Districts to support this endeavor. Our District will vote to participate in this endeavor, at the Summer Council Meeting being held during the D10 Rendezvous in Dubuque, IA on July 26, 2003.

Last May, Safety Officer, Lt Jim Munger, N coordinated a Vessel Examiner's Class that netted us 11 new Vessel Examiners. Added to our current 13 examiners, we now have 24 members conducting Vessel Exams. Congratulations to our newest examiners: D/Lt/C Dave Carlson, N, Lt/C Tracy Nelson, S, Lt. Vessel exams were conducted at the Power Squadron dock on June 7 and at Barker's Island Marina, June 15. Approximately 100 vessel exams were performed over the 2 weekends.

To those who attended our 4th of July Event at the dock: It was a great weekend! Lt/C Grady Strand and 1/Lt Terry Osvold did a tremendous job in organizing and putting it together.

I hope you are enjoying your summer and plan to join us during Labor Day Weekend at our Annual Corn Roast Festivities. Lt/C Grady Strand has a great event in store for us.

Our Power Squadron Dock has seen a lot of upgrades this year: A new deck for socializing and cooking, and an increase in electric power for boaters and motor homes. Check it out if you haven't been there in awhile.







Apostle Island Boaters

I'd like to update everyone on the subject of "wilderness designation" of the Apostle Islands.

According to management assistant Jim Nepstad a recommendation has been drafted and released to the press for public review and comment. An open house in Duluth is scheduled for August 5th at a yet undecided location. A 90 day period for response will conclude October 17th.

The current recommendation by park management is that 80% of the Apostle Island Lakeshore be designated wilderness. That means that 80% of the area should not have any visible signs of past or present human development.

The only things allowed in these areas would be hiking trails and outhouses; no developed campsites, fire rings, or picnic tables. The other 20% would allow the maintenance or natural decay of light houses, farmsteads, quarries, fish camps, etc.

This would include most of Sand, Basswood, and Long Islands, quarry bay area on Stockton, the entire tombola connecting Stockton and Presque. the Presque harbor and campgrounds, the cabin area on Rocky, the fish camp on Manitou, and possibly a few other areas. In essence, pretty much nothing would change while the major land mass of the islands would be legally protected from development in the future.

In contrast, the Wilderness Society has endorsed a much higher % to be in the wilderness category. On May 10th I was involved in the Apostle Island Journalism Program where 15 or so journalists from area newspapers came to hear several speakers: myself representing the boaters' interests, Bob Krumenaker park superintendent, Pro-

fessor William Cronon, U. of Wisconsin wilderness authority, and Rebecca Rom, national president of the wilderness society. After listening to all of the parties involved, I feel the 80-20 proposal is an excellent compromise.

New Outboard Technology Makes Boating Cleaner

Thanks in large part to new technology, the U.S. marine industry is ahead of schedule in complying with the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPS) revisions to the Clean Air Act of 1990. These revisions mandate that hydrocarbon (HC) emissions from new gasoline outboard and personal watercraft engines be reduced by 75 percent by 2006.

Manufacturers are already meeting the 2006 EPA standards. Virtually all engine makers have begun producing cleaner, direct-injection two-stroke and four-stroke outboards that emit fewer pollutants and burn fuel more efficiently.

These new-technology engines are 10 percent to 20 percent more expensive. However, they are more fuel efficient (30-50%) and use much less oil than carbureted two-strokes, and have a longer EPA-mandated warranty making them compare favorably with the less expensive carbureted two-stroke engines. They are also generally quieter with improved starting and throttle response.
