



As fall and winter are fast approaching, I'd like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who had a part in making our summer activities successful. It's been nice seeing such great attendance at our events.

General Meetings and Education Classes are planned throughout the fall and winter. Watch for the fliers and remember to sign up to attend.

I attended the National Fall Governing Board Meeting in Reno, Nevada September 3 – 7. What did I learn? I learned about the Power of One. The power is within you all.

Membership, Marketing, and The Power of One. What does that mean? That means you make a difference. You as a Power Squadron Member have the ability to market the Power Squadron, help retain our members and recruit new members. This is the focus from National for the coming year. Our membership nationally, as well as locally is down. We'd like your help, recruiting new members and focusing on new members, to get them active, as well as the established members, to keep them active and retained within our squadron. Remember, you make a difference, and as a Power of One, all the difference. If every member recruited or helped retain a member, our numbers will once again grow.

Watch for more on this in the future.

Another item that was a hot topic at the FGB Meeting had to deal with the Certification of our Education Instructors.

THE NEED

USPS is a highly regarded educational organization in the recreational boating community, dedicated to the selfeducation of its members and to the providing of safe boating education to the public. As part of the approved strategic plan and the fulfillment of its mission, USPS believes that it should offer the highest quality instruction and materials in all its educational offerings. In cooperation with some states to meet their educational curriculum for boating education, USPS public basic boating safety courses must be NAS-BLA-approved. Many state members of NASBLA now require that USPS use certified instructors; the requirements for certification are currently left to USPS. The benefit of certified instructors is two fold: demonstrate a public awareness of professionalism in the USPS approach to education and curriculum; and, to provide on-the-scene qualified teachers in the case of last minute scheduling emergencies.

To this end, minimum requirements for instructor certification are in order and are hereby established. The certification program outlined below is based on the USPS ID Course and is designed to satisfy the requirements of NASBLA and its member states and territories.

CERTIFICATION

No later than 1 January, 2006,

all instructors of USPS basic boating safety courses offered to the public must be certified. The method of obtaining certification to teach any and all courses is by passing the USPS Instructor Development (ID) Course. Successful completion of ID will result in the issuance of a USPS Instructor's Certificate valid for four years from the date of the ID course completion. It is strongly recommended that all USPS instructors take the Instructor Development Course, whether they are teaching a public course or a course for members only.

Although USPS members are encouraged to take the ID Course, members with certain pre-qualifications may request an initial four-year certification without completing the ID Course, Current members with such pre-qualifications who may request an initial four-year USPS certification are:

- Members who hold active current teaching credentials from an accredited teaching Organization.
- Members who have taught for at least three years within the last five calendar years in an adult education community or as a college instructor.
- Members who have completed either the USPS IQ
 Course or both the USPS IT
 and IA Courses, and who
 have had significant USPS
 classroom or public presentation experience during
 the last three years.

Other members who have completed either IQ of both IT and IA but have no significant USPS of public presentation experience during the past three years must complete a 4-hour ID recertification seminar to qualify for initial four –year certification. USPS certification is valid for four years. Recertification of all instructors

requires completion of the USPS four hour ID recertification seminar.

Whew, sounds busy, doesn't it?

As a reminder to all of you, Duluth is hosting the District Conference, October 31 – November 2 at the Inn On Lake Superior. We'd like to see a good turn out from Duluth members. Don't wait to send in your registration. Come for good times, educational meetings, and to meet and greet new friends.

At our District Fall Conference, there will also be a Teaching Aids display and judging. Winners will go on to National. If you've always thought there might be some way to make our classes easier to understand, put together a display and bring it with you to the Fall Conference.







Isle Royale National Park Announces Publication of Proposed Rules for New Boating and Water Use Regulations in National Park System

(HOUGHTON, MI) --- Isle Royale National Park announced today that new rules regarding boating and water use regulations in the National Park System have been published and are available to the public for review and comment. The public is encouraged to examine the proposed rules and provide comment to the NPS.

These new regulations would cause some changes at Isle Royale National Park. They would limit maximum speeds in quiet and no-wake zones to no more than 5 mph, even in rougher sea conditions where currently speeds greater than 5 mph are allowed. In addition, vessels would be prohibited from exceeding no-wake speeds when traveling within 100 feet of

manually propelled, anchored or drifting vessel, or someone swimming, wading, fishing or floating with the aid of a nonmotorized inflatable or rigid buoyant device. Also, powerdriven or sailing vessels would not be able to operate within 100' of a diver's flag. Currently, such vessels can operate within 100' of a diver's flag, as long as they do not exceed 5 mph or create a wake. Finally, operators whose blood or breath is 0.08 grams or more of alcohol per 100 milliliters of blood or 0.08 grams or more of alcohol per 210 liters of breath would be prohibited from driving a boat. Currently, the law prohibits the operation of a vessel when the operator is under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance to a degree that may endanger him or herself or another person, or damage property or park resources.

The process of rewriting these regulations began in 1997 specifically to address changing visitor use patterns and technologies and boating and water safety issues. The last time these regulations were revised was in 1983. The goal of the proposed regulations is to provide greater consistency with U.S. Coast Guard and state laws and regulations, establish rules that will be more clearly understood by the visiting

public and that can be more effectively communicated and enforced by NPS personnel. "It has been difficult for us to effectively enforce regulations that the public doesn't understand" said National Park Service Director Fran Mainella. "We are pleased to be moving in the direction of straightforward, understandable regulations and most importantly, a safer park experience for our visitors." An important emphasis in the proposed regulations is safety for children, something that has not been apparent in the current boating regulations.

The National Park Service is seeking comments from the public to determine if the proposed regulations make the parks safer places to visit for boaters and non-boaters, and if they help accomplish the mission of the NPS. The proposed regulations can be located and viewed on the Federal Register website at www.gpoaccess.gov/fr/advanced. html. The public may submit comments through December 24, 2003. Instructions for submitting comments can be found in the proposed regulations. Once the comment period is over, the NPS will review and analyze the responses before publishing the final regulations.
