


We will be starting our General meetings again. September 16 will be the first one at the Shack in Superior. Look for the flier. I hope to see you all there.



#### **Squadron Safety Officer's Report**

Hello Prospective Students and Instructors,

With Fall coming on, it is time to be making plans to attend or teach a Power Squadron class. Scheduled offerings this year include:

- 1. Seamanship, October, 12 sessions.
- 2. Piloting, October, 10 sessions and Advance Piloting, 8 sessions.
- 3. Public Boating: November, December and January. Two classes of 7 sessions each.
- 4. Seamanship again in February.
- 5. Jr. Navigation, November for 15 sessions.

All classes are planned for Duluth Community Education, using primarily Duluth Central High School.

All our classes (with only occasional exceptions) are taught by Duluth Power Squadron members. We rely upon members with advanced Power Squadron grades or special knowledge and experience to teach our classes, both to the public and to other Duluth Power Squadron members.

Please volunteer your time and talent to our educational program. You may participate as an instructor responsible for all sessions of a class, or for only one or two sessions if you prefer. You may also volunteer to be present as an assistant/advisor in the class giving you the opportunity to gain confidence in your own presentation ability.

Currently 41% of our members have only taken the Public Boating class, so I am offering Seamanship twice this year to give many members a chance to attend. Seamanship teaches proper boat handling, safety, and many other subjects like marlinspike, docking and anchoring. Piloting is a newly rewritten course for coastal piloting that inte-

grates the use of charts with GPS. Jr. Navigation teaches the skills needed for off shore navigation. This class will be in study group format and will continue for many months. Other elective courses not currently scheduled are available in the Squadron curriculum-Weather, Cruise Planning, Marine Electronics, Engine Maintenance, Sail. Buy a text and self study or form a study group then test when you are ready. Call me for info. And once more---Please volunteer to teach or assist or help organize a class. Education is our purpose and the Squadron needs your participation. Thank you. See you in class!





If you find serenity and happiness, some may be jealous; Be happy anyway.




