### EDUCATION

OUR GOAL WAS TO CONTINUE TO OFFER QUALITY CLASSES TAUGHT BY QUALITY INSTRUCTORS. THROUGH JOE HESCH'S LEADERSHIP THIS WAS DONE. WE OFFERED TWO SAFE BOATING, BOAT SMART, SEAMANSHIP,

PILOTING, AND ADVANCED PILOTING. THE "TOP NOTCH" WE CAN DRAW UPON IN THIS SQUADRON IS AMAZING.

### BUDGET

IN 2004 WE HAD A POOR AUCTION IN TERMS OF A FUNDRAISER. WE NETTED ABOUT \$3,500. IN 2005 WE NETTED OVER \$10,000 AFTER EXPENSES. BUDGET PROBLEMS OVER. DURING THE YEAR WE TOOK AWAY THE FUNDRAISING DUTIES FROM THE ADMIN OFFICER AND GAVE THAT REPONSIBILITY TO THE COMMANDER AND HIS/HER COMMITTEE.

### LAKE ACTIVITES

THE DINGHY RUN AT CRANE LAKE WAS A GREAT TIME WITH OVER 30 PEOPLE ATTENDING. I HOPE THESE ACTIVITES WILL CONTINUE WITH MORE MEMBERS PARTICIPATING.

### VESSEL SAFETY CHECKS

THE GOAL WAS TO IMPROVE ON NUMBERS OF EXAMINERS AND EXAMS. WE HAD 24 EXAMINERS DOING 356 EXAMS. WE ARE THE "SHINING STAR" OF DISTRICT 10, AS NO OTHER SQUADRON EVEN COMES CLOSE. WHAT A HUGE COMMUNITY SERVICE THIS IS!

# **Executive Officer's Report**

I was thinking recently about the Squadron, its beginning, and rich history. The old hellship, "Huloa", the "Tossing Tessie". "Seabird", "Flying Dutchman" were a few of the old boats belonging to some of the early Squadron members, who moored up at some of the first gettogethers. (What label of beer did they drink back then? Royal Bohemian, Fitgers?). Whether we're an old afterguard P/C (mossyback), sitting back and enjoying the fruits of our years of labor (or not), or a newer member recently joining the ranks and taking our first boating/piloting class, I sense there is a certain pride in being a member of our organization. Part of it is I believe, the impact the Squadron has had for almost 3/4 of a century in the boating community, in and around the Duluth, Superior Harbor. (During WWII, the U.S. Navy commissioned Squadron members who hadn't left for the battlefields to do homeland security in our harbor-Don't think they ever found any U-Boats, but they kept a "sailor's eye" on the dozen or so war-effort shipbuilding yards).

I have heard stories of members appreciating the impact the Duluth Power Squadron has had on their lives, whether it was growing up at the "dock" as a youngster of a member, or learning "the ropes" from their first boating and safety class offered by the Squadron, which helped launch the member into graduating to a 50 ton charter license. That's big.

Things change. Times change, and members change. It's been a great volunteer organization, and I believe it will continue to be a great volunteer organization. And this is where we move forward. By or around February 1, 2006 when you will have received your new Channel Chatter, and are reading these articles, I am going to believe that the incoming Bridge will be at a full compliment. With that we will have a lot of already seasoned leaders who have stepped up to continue to build upon the


# Ship's Store Opening Soon


