

During the first week of May, the spring **Squadron Boating class** reached a conclusion. I appreciate Steve Farrell's commitment to teaching the course. Twenty-five people successfully completed the course and at least five of them have become members of the squadron. I am thrilled to announce that we have a full slate of member courses scheduled for next fall, winter and spring. Right now it seems like it is time to go boating; and it is! 





"Rules of the Road"

Ignoring minimum wake zones can be costly

Whether you are an experienced sailor or are renting a boat for the first time, every captain needs to keep a sharp eye for boaters not conforming to the "Rules of the Road." There are a lot of folks out driving boats and many of them should not be. We have seen way too many persons behind the wheel of a boat who have no idea what they are doing and often cause accidents.

Keeping right is an important rule for any boat operator. You are supposed to stay to the right side of the channel and you should stay to the right when meeting a boat head-on. The steering wheel of many boats is on the right side, opposite of car steering wheels. This may confuse a lot of people when they meet oncoming traffic on the side they are sitting on, not keeping to the right.

Any vessel operating in a speed zone posted as slow speed-minimum wake must operator fully off plane and completely settled in water. This means no white tops showing on your wake and that your bow does not rise at all.

Drinking while driving a boat can get you in trouble in a hurry. Boating under the influence can get really expensive when you have to pay a hefty fine. The most important thing to do when piloting a boat is to think. Realize what you are doing and plan ahead. Know the rules and obey them. Other safe boating practices are to wear a life jacket; follow local navigation rules; be courteous and responsible operators.

You cannot necessarily predict when an accident might happen, which is why it is important that you boat with safety in mind.


Boating Back in Time

This photo was taken in Conneaut, Ohio back in the late 1930's. Pictured is the Great Lakes Towing's tug "MINNESOTA", as a steam powered tug, which even then was nearing some thirty years of age. Of special interest is the reality, that this small vessel, built in 1911, is presently stationed in Duluth, and (repowered in 1960) is still giving a good account of herself after some 95+ years of service, which is rather unbelievable... Shortly after the Company began repowering their fleet of steam tugs in 1949-



1950, the "MINNESOTA" was one of the two steam tugs that was involved in an experimental tug-of-war, held at Conneaut The newly rebuilt/repowered "NORTH DAKOTA" was pitted against the "MINNESOTA" and "KENTUCKY" which were still under steam. The old "steam" diehards were disillusioned on that day, when at full throttle ahead for all three tugs, the repowered diesel pushed the two "steamers" backward at about one-half mile per hour!!! This event signaled the end of STEAM as it was evident that the Company's repowering program was highly successful. Pictured behind the "MINNESOTA" is the tug "NEW YORK". These two tugs served the very busy port of Conneaut for many years through this era of time!!!

A Request from Your Historian


