Education Officer's Report

It is winter which is Education season in our squadron. It is a time we can think and learn about safe boating adventures. To that end, the Duluth Sail and Power Squadron Education department is offering a full slate of member courses this winter and spring. I am a happy to announce that **Engine Maintenance** and **Advanced Piloting** began the first week of January.

Six students have begun the **Advanced Piloting** course. Under the guidance of instructors John O'Neil and Jim Robinson, they will study advance course plotting techniques, coordination of radar and chart information, the effects of wind currents on a boats course and much more.

Harlan Eggert began coaching 5 members in *Engine Maintenance*. Assisted by Bill Carlson, Harlan will teach the intricacies of inboard gasoline and diesel engines as well as outboards and stern drives. An invaluable section of this course introduces the "Get Home" kit and an emergency spare parts kit.

I appreciate the efforts of instructors Harlan Eggert, Bill Carlson, Jim Robinson and John O'Neil.

As you have seen in another section, **Weather** and **Seamanship** will be offered this spring. Meteorologist Dave Anderson, who is also a Coast Guard Auxiliary

member, will teach **Weather.** The course is scheduled for 10 weeks which is a large time commitment for some people. It is taught in two, five week modules with separate exams. If you are interested in taking **Weather** but are extremely

busy, consider taking just the first module this year.

New members should be aware there is somewhat of a sequence to Advanced Grade courses. After you have completed the **Squadron Boating course** and become a member, **Seamanship** is the next logical course in which to enroll. This order is not a requirement but a suggestion. **Seamanship** is a great course to complete prior to **Piloting**, where you learn to plot and follow a course. Successful completion of **Piloting** IS a requirement for enrolling in **Advanced Piloting**. I am pleased to announce **Seamanship** will once again be taught by Keith Kymala.





Many Words Have Seagoing Origin

So much of the language used today comes from the salty brine of the sea.

Our English language is flexible, and words have taken on different meaning throughout the ages. Many of the words to-day were born of the sea.

Bowing and scraping: In the English Navy an officer's cocked hat was called a scraper. To bow and scrape originally meant to remove one's hat in salute of a superior. In today's usage it has come to mean servile toward someone or to show humility.

Flimsy: This was originally a certificate similar to a transfer



in the Navy. The report was made on paper like that used in newspapers and comes from the word "film" Today it has come to mean weak as "He had a flimsy excuse."

Barge: In today's interpretation it means to aggressively force your way in or barge into a meeting. The word comes from the Greek "barks" for boat. Also, Latin for barge is a ship of burden. The earliest barges carried a huge load making them difficult to maneuver.

Let the cat out of the bag: Cat was short for whip, like a cat-of-nine tails. It was kept in a bag. When it was taken out, someone was in for a flogging. Hence to let the cat out of the bag was to put an unpleasant state of affairs into motion. To-day, the expression carries the same connotation, to allow a secret to escape, to disclose information, usually unintentionally.

Touch and go: A vessel that lightly grazed the bottom, but was fortunate enough to continue making headway. We can all relate to this. In today's usage, it's something that's precarious, risky and just about comes off. For example: "It was touch and go whether he would pass the celestial navigation course."

To break new ground: To haul the anchor from the bottom where it was embedded and set off on a new voyage. In today's usage for example: "He broke new ground by being the first man to the moon."

The bitter end: A sailor's name for the end of the rope that is secured to the bitts on the ship while tied up or at anchor. Today, a person could exclaim, "He saw the project through to the bitter end."
