

Common Boat Insurance Claims...and how to avoid one

Striking submerged objects:

Typically after a storm, lots of debris is washed into the water. Hitting anything floating could damage your prop, rudder and shaft as well as put a hole in the bottom of the boat. If you hit something in the water, STOP and check for leaks. Water in the bilge might be an indication of serious damage. Having charts for the area and knowing how to use them might help you avoid an expensive bump.

Water inside your boat:

The first rule of boating is to keep the water outside the boat. There are holes put in the boat's bottom to accommodate gears such as transducers, heads, etc. Many underwater holes have sea cocks which may last a few years before they get tired and fail. The openings and fittings must be periodically inspected. Out drive bellows after five years are living on borrowed times. Boats, even boats with self- bailing cockpits, can be sunk by rainwater. Clogged scuppers could cause a boat to fill with rainwater and sink.

Collisions:

With the ever increasing number of boats on the water, collisions are on the rise. Collisions happen with docks and pilings; however collisions with other boats are the most serious. Too much speed, blind spots and inattention are usually the culprits. Good advice would be to stay to the right and pass others port to port and slow down. A good knowledge of the Rules of the Road could help to avoid out in the open collision.

In the end, the skipper should take whatever action necessary


to avoid collision and make it obvious what his intentions are early.

Grounding:

A well known rule states: If the depth of the water is less than the boat's draft, you are aground. It is not always a good idea to attempt to power off grounding; you might get into deeper trouble not into deeper water. It is possible you could take mud into your engine causing it to overheat. Careful charting and a good depth sounder is your best defense against grounding.

Cran-Blueberry Sauce

1 and 1/2 cups cranberry juice cocktail

1/4 cup sugar

2 tablespoons cornstarch

1 teaspoon cinnamon

1 and 1/2 cups fresh or frozen blueberries

3 tablespoons orange juice, if desired

Mix together the sugar, cornstarch, and cinnamon. Add to the cranberry cocktail in a saucepan, blend. Stir in berries. Cook over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until mixture thickens and boils. Boil and stir one minute. Cool slightly. Stir in orange juice.






