Commander's Report

The Duluth Squadron was fortunate to have several members representing our Squadron at the USPS District 10 Fall Conference held during the first weekend of November. The agenda included several meetings for local squadron officers and workshops of general interest to our members. The officer meetings, designed to support the local squadrons, were hosted by the District 10 Bridge and included roundtable discussions. This conference's workshop sessions included an array of topics including first aid certification, the USPS "Boat Handling Under Power" Seminar, an update on using the USPS data base (DB2000) and introduction to Sail Angle.

Communication being an important topic this year, I attended the workshop that provided information on Sail Angle. Launched in January 2009, Sail Angle is free public website that is a "hybrid between a boating orientated social network and a communication and information exchange platform where the content is supplied by it members". It combines aspects of social networking with a communication and information exchange. Having a format similar to what you find in Facebook, it is an impressive resource on boating. It's unique features include an "Ask-a-Pro" section that puts members in touch with seasoned professional mariners, a "Destinations" feature that provides worldwide local boating knowledge and information posted by members who have boated to locations, and information postings that span a wide array of boating tips.

Due to an agreement between **Sail Angle** and USPS, you as a local member of our squadron are able to login (**www.sailangle.com**) using your certificate number. I would encourage you to check it out and take advantage of the information it offers. By design, the website not only provides important boating topics for broad public appeal, but it serves as a communication link within USPS, having benefits for both individual mem-

bers and for the squadron. As more of our local members become accustomed to using this site, we will be able to use it for intersauadron communications. Please let us know if you would like to get more involved in this program to update the postings, so that our squadron can take advantage of its features.

Credit for Coast Guard Course Work

As of December 2007, a United States Power Squadron policy for recognizing individuals who have US Coast Guard or USCG Auxiliary certificates, both as members and for grade recognition, was passed. This change in policy will not only allow Coast Guard Auxiliarists that hold Coast Guard certificates to become members of USPS but will also acknowledge the skills and education they bring with them.

You may be asking, "Why is this information important to me as a Power Squadron member?"

At least two advanced education awards – Educational Achievement and Educational Proficiency—are attained by having these courses. And the new program—Boat Operator Certificate—requires many of these courses as well.

I encourage any current member of the Duluth Sail and Power Squadron who holds any of the certificates below for course work from the Coast Guard and/or Coast Guard Auxiliary to submit a copy of those certificates to me. I will pass them on to the National Education Officer to facilitate obtaining the equivalent USPS grade.

National will allow USPS grades for successful completion of the following CGAUX courses and CG licensing programs:

- → CGAUX Boating Skills and Seamanship or Sailing Skills and Seamanship will receive credit for the USPS Seamanship course.
- → CGAUX Basic Coastal Navigation will receive credit for the USPS Piloting course.
- → CGAUX Advanced Coastal Navigation will receive credit for the USPS Advanced Piloting course.
- ★ Coast Guard Launch Operator will receive credit for the USPS BoatSmart course.
- ★ Coast Guard OUPV (Six-pack) will receive credit for the USPS Seamanship course.
- → Coast Guard Master's license (up to 50 tons) will receive credit for USPS Seamanship, Piloting and Advanced Piloting.

Any other credit will be based on a level of experience provided to the NEO for review and approval.

Insurance an Important Piece of Boating Lifestyle

If you own a boat, you need boat insurance.

Many states now require boat owners to carry watercraft liability insurance before they operate a boat. If your boat has been financed your lender will almost always require you to carry full coverage boat insurance.

You need to carry at least a minimal liability policy to protect you in case your boat ever injures anyone or you could wind up stuck with someone else's medical bills, even if you are not directly responsible.

To protect yourself beyond the \$300,000 or \$400,000 liability policy, consider carrying an umbrella policy for \$1,000,000 or more as additional protection against disabling or fatal accidents.

Boats do not have brakes nor do they stay on course unless you have an autopilot that is tied into a GPS or set to hold a straight course. Do not follow the boat in the front of you too closely. If the boat stops and you were not paying attention, you could ram their boat. At 30 mph, you cover 1.2 miles in a minute and 300 feet in just seconds, that does not give you much time to react in trying to avoid an accident.

To prevent accidents, keep a sharp lookout at all times. Check the weather forecast before leaving. Tell someone where you are going and when you will return.



Never overload the boat. A 25 foot boat can carry eight people or 1,400 pounds. You must take into account a 100 gallon fuel tank which can add 600 pounds, a 30-40 gallon fresh water tank which, when full, weighs over 240 pounds and the pump out tank, if full, could add another 240 pounds. Add this to the additional weight of the gear and tools you carry and you are approaching more than 1000 pounds. All this extra weight costs additional fuel to propel your boat.

Avoid alcohol when boating.

Take at least two means of communication, including VHF radio, flares, cell phone in a plastic bag and Emergency Position Indication Radio Beacon. Also know your location. Be able to communicate that information in an emergency. If the boat capsizes and remains afloat, stay with the vessel. It is a lot easier to see a boat in the water than a person.



Once in a Blue Moon

A **blue moon** is a <u>full moon</u> that is not timed to the regular monthly pattern. Most years have twelve full moons which occur approximately monthly, but in addition to those twelve full lunar cycles, each calendar year contains an excess of roughly eleven days. The extra days accumulate, so that every two or three years there is an extra full moon. The extra moon is called a "blue moon."

The <u>Farmer's Almanac</u> defines *blue moon* as an extra full moon that occurs in a season; one season is normally three full moons. If a season has four full moons, then the third full moon is named a *blue moon*. Recent popular usage defines a blue moon as the second full moon in a month. The term "blue moon" is commonly used to describe the rarity of an event, as in the expression, "once in a blue moon."

As you can see by our calendar on the next page, New Year's Eve 2009 will be a night of a Blue Moon.

Caramel Puff Corn

1 8 oz. bag "Old Dutch Puff Corn"

1/2 lb. butter

1 cup brown sugar

1/2 cup corn syrup

1 tsp. baking soda

Place corn puffs in a large roaster pan. In a 2 quart saucepan cook butter, brown sugar and corn syrup until it boils. Boil for 2 minutes, stirring constantly. Add 1 teaspoon of soda and stir until mixture foams.

Pour caramel mixture over corn curls and stir until well mixed. Place in 250 degree oven for 45 minutes. Stir at least every 10 to 15 minutes. Remove from oven and pour on wax paper and break apart. Let cool. Store in air tight canister.


