Our Vessel Safety Check program is in high gear, with approximately 114 exams completed. June 5<sup>th</sup>, starting at 1500 at the Duluth Squadron Dock will be the next scheduled group inspection site, this will be followed with another group scheduled on June 12<sup>th</sup> at Barkers Island. People who are not birthed at Barkers may bring their boat to the transit dock at Barkers or, if on a trailer, tow them over and come to the club room in the Barkers Island Ship Store building starting at 0900 until noon. Barkers is a joint effort between the Coast Guard Auxiliary and the Duluth Sail & Power Squadron. ### **Education Officer's Report**

Happy Summer. It looks to have the makings of a glorious boating Season, along with an increase in boating traffic and incidents. As the DPS Education Officer, I have to ask the question "what can the Squadron Education Department do to help boaters be safer?"

Increasing safety awareness is the foundation of the USPS. Safety through EDUCATION has always been the message. The challenge for us is how we, as a squadron, get people to participate when "nobody has time." I try to always respect people's time commitment to Education. Committing one night a week for 10 – 12 weeks is often an impossible task. Hopefully with the help of technology, we can bridge the time gap and encourage participation in classes. Here is the plan;

The Website for DPS Education is going to be changed. Education web page will have links to course descriptions, public and member only. Also, there will be a link to a course waiting list. This list will consist of people interested in taking the course allowing us to provide the classes the membership is interested in. You will also have an opportunity to register for a class when it is offered, on line. Class material costs will increase for registering for classes beginning 30 days prior to Session 1. Register 30 days prior you only pay for the material. Under 30 days material will have a 30% surcharge to cover shipping and handling expenses the squadron will incur.

Classes are going to use Webinars to handle some class material. Sessions will normally be about 90 minutes and include subjects that can be taught in a Webinar. This will decrease time commitments to classes. I am currently reviewing all the classes for potential opportunities. The webinar would be on your home computer at a designated time.

Various seminars will be presented as Webinars. Every Thursday in July and August a different Seminar will be held. Preregistration will be required and participation is limited to 25 people. Cost will be \$30.00 with material and if no material is requested seminars will cost \$10.00. Preregistration will require payment.

To accomplish these goals I will need assistance from

the membership. Anyone who can volunteer for 4 hours over this Watch year, please, contact me. There are open positions for Electives Chair, Seminar Chair. I need committee members to help things run smooth and provide input for direction.

### Know the Signs and Basic Treatment of Hypothermia

Hypothermia is a decrease in body temperature resulting in reduced circulation and muscle strength. A drop of only one or two degrees in the core temperature will cause impaired judgment. Cold water robs the body of heat 25-30 times faster than air. A person's core temperature begins to drop within 10-15 minutes of falling overboard. The more energy someone spends after falling overboard, the more quickly his or her body temperature drops, reducing survival time. Wearing a life jacket adds to survival times in the water not only by minimizing motion needed to stay afloat, but also by helping insulate the body.

Symptoms of hypothermia include shivering, numbness, drowsiness, muscle weakness, dizziness, nausea, low body temperature, weak or slow pulse and large pupils. Get the person out of the water or weather as quickly as possible. Replace wet clothes with dry ones.



Wrap the person in blankets to slowly warm them. Hanhyperthermia victims gently and do not give them anything by mouth if they are unconscious. Never give alcohol to a hyperthermia victim. professional Get help as soon as possible.

If you do fall in the water, your best chance of survival lies in getting out. If possible, climb onto an overturned board, debris or anything that will lift your body off of the water. Limit your movement if you are unable to get out of the water. Survival time varies by person and time spent in certain water temperatures.

Here is a guideline for expected survival times by temperature of water:

70-80 degrees: three hours to indefinitely

• 60-70 degrees: two to 40 hours

• 50-60 degrees: one to six hours

40-50 degrees: one to three hours

• 32.5 - 40 degrees: 30 to 90 minutes

• 32 degrees: under 15 to 45 minutes

Stay seated while under way to avoid falling into the water. Do not hang over the side or sit on the edge of the gunnels. Keep away from wet decks and wear deck shoes. Keep the decks clear and free of debris. Skippers should notify the crew and passengers when changing speeds, going from idle to plane or vice versa. Also make passengers aware when making turns and tell your crew if the boat is going to be caught in the wake of other boats.

### It Floats, You Don't—Wear Your Life Jacket

This picture was taken at the Canal Park Marine Museum on Thursday May 27, at precisely 10:00 am to coordinate with an attempt across the country including Canada to set a world record for inflating life jackets. Duluth members involved were Greg Brisky, Bill Gooder, Donn Larson, Doug Dahl, Jenelle Hewitt, Charlie Grubb and Dave Carlson. The action was captured on film by KDLH Channel 3 and many other cameras. This also was the kickoff event for National Safe Boating week. Superior Mayor David Ross and Duluth Council member Todd Fedora read proclamations supporting Safe Boating Week May 22 thru May 29, 2010.






