

One very big change this year will be the use of the Squadron Website,


www.duluthsailandpowersquadron.com. This new website will continue to grow and hopefully become a conduit for communication through out the Squadron.

### "Language of the Seas" Sails in From Earlier Times

On why boats are "shes" and right is "starboard"

Have you ever wondered why all ships are referred to in the feminine gender? Many of our nautical expressions and terms come from England and go back centuries. An explanation of why ships are called "she" is because the word "ship" is in the feminine gender in all romance languages.



Spit and polish goes back to the Victorian era where a sailor's spittle and a little polish were needed to keep gear looking ship shape.

The origins of the term "port" for the left side of the vessel and "starboard" for the right is an interesting story. It is believed that "port" referred to a harbor. Three centuries ago, the steering gear was on the right, so the ship always tied up to port side to. The steering board was on the right, so the right side became starboard.

The universal distress call "SOS" has no meaning. It was adopted in 1908 because three dots, three dashes and three dots were easy to remember. "Mayday" is a mispronunciation of the French word "maidez," or help me.

"Fathom" is a nautical measurement of about 6 feet. Originally it meant the length of a man's arms when wrapped around the object of his affection.

Splice the main brace when the sun goes down over the yardarm comes from the old sailing days, when it was difficult and dangerous work to splice the main brace or mainstay, and the crew would receive a double shot of rum when the job was complete.

Boat owners, it will soon be time to launch your boats for another season on the water. Let's make it a safe 2011. Our Squadron will have 15 examiners this year. We will have an organized exam day at Barker's Island as in the

past. When the date is set, I will send all examiners an email with the date and time. We already have a date set to do exams at the Air National Guard Base. Sorry examiners, if you were going to sign up for this one, but it is now filled.

Last year, we did 294 exams. Let's see if we can do more this year.

If you were an examiner in the past and want to get back on board send me an email and we can get you setup.





## **Harbor History**



The **Arrowhead Bridge**, foreground, was in use from 1927—1984. It crossed the St. Louis Bay connecting Minnesota and Wisconsin. Constructed mainly of wooden trestles with a center drawbridge span, it was a toll bridge until 1963. The Arrowhead was demolished in the mid 80's, but a portion on the Wisconsin side was maintained as a fishing pier until 2010, when it was replaced with a new fishing pier. In the background are the Grassy Point Bridge (rail) and the Bong Bridge.



#### **Easy Rhubarb Cake**

4 cups chopped rhubarb

1/2 cup sugar

3 oz. pkg. strawberry Jello

White or yellow cake mix

1 cup water

1/3 cup melted butter

Whipped cream or topping

Put rhubarb in a 9x13 baking dish. Sprinkle



with sugar and dry jello. Beat the cake mix with water and butter, pour over rhubarb to cover completely. Bake at 350 for 45 minutes. Serve warm or cool with whipped cream.

#### Sauteed Asparagus

1/2 cup Balsamic Vinaigrette dressing

1 red or yellow pepper, cut in strips

1 small onion, cut in wedges

1 lb. fresh asparagus

1/4 cup parmesan cheese

Heat half of the dressing in a large non-stick skillet. Add pepper strips and onion, cook 4 or 5 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add asparagus and remaining dressing. Cover and simmer on low heat 5—7 minutes until asparagus is crisp-tender. Top with cheese.




