

### **Mentor Duluth**

For the third consecutive year, the Duluth Sail and Power Squadron hosted a group of kids from Mentor Duluth for a safety presentation, lunch and a harbor cruise based out of the Squadron Dock on Saturday, September 14.

Hosted by volunteers from the Squadron, this event always gets a great response and is one of our most important annual civic events. Teaming up with Mentor Duluth allows us to reach a segment of area youth who would not otherwise have access to this kind of instruction, so we are happy to host them every year.

Seventy percent of the fatal accidents involving boats involve individuals with no formal boating instruction and this statistic emphasizes the importance of starting this instruction early. The Duluth Sail & Power Squadron propels its mission by offering kids from Mentor Duluth an opportunity to navigate the Duluth-Superior Harbor and learn basic safety tips.

Interested Mentor Duluth "swabbies" gathered at the Squadron pavilion for a cookout followed by a PowerPoint presentation covering swimming and boating safety, rip currents, river currents, and spending time in and around water crafts. The young cadets then boarded the volunteers' vessels for an afternoon voyage.

There are over 200 kids on Mentor Duluth's waiting list so the organization tries to offer activities that will keep the kids interested until they can find mentor matches for them. This nautical event attracts a significant number of them, and it helps Mentor Duluth understand their interests, ultimately helping to make better matches for them. Mentor Duluth, located at Duluth's YMCA, assists





eligible youth with healthy development to become contributing members of society, matching youngsters with positive adult and student role models. Their website has information on how to become a mentor: www.mentorduluth.org

Thanks to Commander Lance Olson, Executive Officer Jason Smitke, and Past Commander Dave Stokes for coordinating this event and offering their vessels and captain services for the cruise on the harbor.
