Saturday morning started with a pancake breakfast, sponsored by Perkins and the Flaherty family, which was great and is always enjoyable. Then we boarded a bus that took many members over to the Great Lakes Aquarium for tours and the interactive displays, including the shipwrecks display.


Sunday was another really nice July day with several outof-town members touring the harbor and lake aboard boats and exploring the area by car.







Please use the form to list your activities. You can always use another sheet of paper if the form is not enough room. Make sure to include the content of the activity, the number of meetings and the number of hours it took to complete an activity. Don't forget to put your name and certificate number on it.

Remember, the Merit Mark year goes from January 1, 2014, to December 31, 2014. If you're not sure if an activity or event qualifies for a Merit Mark, write it down; we will make that decision. Remember, this is your

only payment for your hard work.

Family members are eligible for a Merit Mark. Please make sure to include anyone that is a family member in your submission, so that they get credit for their time worked.

All of your Bridge this year thanks you for your time and efforts put forward this past year. THANK YOU! Now, start writing and mail, fax or email the form back soon!
