




Tours & Sightseeing in Duluth

The Great Lakes Aquarium

This was established as an educational showcase of the economic, recreational, biological and aesthetic importance of freshwater resources with a particular focus on Lake Superior. This is the only aquarium in the U.S. that focuses on freshwater exhibits. There are plenty of interactive exhibits and re-created habitats are fun and educational. The aquarium is open from 10 AM until 6 PM. **The cost is \$20.00 (\$16.00 for Seniors)**



Bent Paddle Brewing Co



Glensheen, The Historic Congdon Estate

Finished in 1908, this Lake Superior 39-room mansion enjoys a rare, intact collection of original furnishings and art. Because of that, it closely resembles the days when the Congdon family first occupied it. Truly, it is Duluth's answer to Downton Abbey. Situated on a wooded lot, the home boasts spectacular views of Lake Superior, as well as, multiple gardens including formal, flower and vegetable. Guests are also encouraged to explore the carriage house, boat house, stone bridge and pier. Children enjoy the pebbled beach for hours of rock skipping while parents take in a sit on one of Adirondack chairs. Be sure to check out Glensheen as part of your must-do on your Duluth bucket list. **The cost is \$20.00 (\$16.00 for Seniors)** for your self-guided tour.



Lake Superior Maritime Visitor Center

This maritime museum details the Great Lakes' history and the part they played in the shipping industry. This center is a "must see" in the Duluth area. The museum is in Duluth's Canal Park near the Aerial Lift Bridge and over overlooks the entrance to the Duluth-

Superior harbor. All visitors are welcomed to visit this museum without paying. Exhibits demonstrate the history and operations of the upper Great lakes commercial shipping and the Aerial Lift Bridge. A 3 story steam engine, 50 scale models and many interactive displays are available for visitors to explore.
